



Land Based Learning Activities and Camps

Background

Land Based Learning (LBL) and local cultural teachings are foundational to address the growing concern for the conservation and sustainability of traditional hunting and gathering practices. Students will focus on the ideal of stewardship in caring for the environment (forests and watersheds), providing students the opportunity to experience Cree traditional outdoor activities (contemporary and traditional) and learn about their natural physical and spiritual environment in local and cultural context focused on traditional and contemporary Cree cultural practices.

Through land-based learning opportunities, students will be exposed to experiential learning activities that provide them with a unique form delivery. The teachings place them in a natural outdoor environment consistent with the traditional Cree hunter-gatherer culture. Land Based Learning will provide a challenge to individuals to discover new personal limits and build leadership skills and confidence utilizing traditional Cree language, knowledge and teachings.

Land Based Learning provides the opportunity to have students learning outside the conventional classroom and placed in a more personal environment centered within the oral tradition-style learning of Cree peoples through highlighting the role of Elders and Knowledge Keepers.

Guidelines

Students will be provided the opportunity to work with and learn directly with Elders and Knowledge Keepers in a Cree traditional manner of knowledge and Cree Language transmission.
