Driver Responsibilities and Licensing

Background

KTCEA is committed to operating a safe, respectful student transportation system. School bus drivers play an integral role in ensuring that students arrive at schools safely and ready to learn, and are returned home in a safe and respectful manner.

Guidelines

Drivers should have access to appropriate training to enable them to be successful in their roles.

Drivers are responsible for the safe operation of the vehicles at all times.

Drivers are responsible for the safety of their riders during the operation of their routes. Principals and the Superintendent or designate are responsible for any disciplinary actions needed to support the ongoing safe operation of school bus routes.

1.	 School Bus Drivers must be certified and licensed for the vehicles they operate. All Drivers must have at least an Alberta Class 1 or 2 license. obtain the 'S' Endorsement (MELT) within the first 3 months of active service. attain their 'S' Endorsement Refresher every 3 years. attain Level C First Aid Training with CPR within the first 10 months of service. attend monthly safety meetings and group in-service sessions as required by the Transportation Manager. attend First Aid and CPR refresher courses, as they are made available within the KTCEA, subject to the approval of the Transportation Manager. provide at least 10 hours service after upgrading their license credentials with the support of KTCEA. notify the Transportation Manager of any changes to the status of their operator's license including demerits within 24 hours of such change. In term drivers 5.1 5.2 5.3 5.4 5.5 5.6 5.7 5.8 5.9 5.10 5.11 5.12 5.13	s of performing the primary role of transporting students, must adhere to all KTCEA policies and administrative procedures, including but not limited to AP 630A School Bus Safety - Students and Parent Responsibilities. provide a phone number to the Transportation Manager and the principal where the driver can be reached in case of emergency. provide a Criminal Records Check prior to employment. advise the Transportation Manager upon being charged with an offense under the Criminal Code of Canada. not make any changes to the routes except in emergency situations where a road hazard or unsafe condition is encountered, and immediately reporting such occasions to the Transportation Manager. notify the principal of any inappropriate or unsafe behavior and making a record in the School Bus Incident Book. never leave the bus while the motor is running and there is a passenger on board. never leave the bus without stopping the motor, removing the leys, setting the brake and closing the door, and using hazard lights where appropriate. never fuel the bus with a passenger on board. immediately notify the Transportation Manager of a breakdown or emergency. have no physical contact with a passenger or their belongings except in an emergency situation. refuse to allow any unauthorized person from boarding the bus and reporting any such attempt to the Transportation Manager. immediately disclose any medical condition (e.g., mental, physical, medication-related) which might affect the driver's ability to safely operate the bus or perform their duties. 	6.3	comply with Alberta Traffic Laws and reporting any traffic violations to the Transportation Manager.	
	6.4	ensure that the bus is cleaned and sufficiently heated for safe operation.	
	6.5	report any bus accidents, however small or large, to the Transportation Manager and school principal.	
	6.6	report any road hazards or equipment safety issues to the Transportation Manager.	
	6.7	contact the Transportation Manager and principal in the case of illness or any other inability to perform their scheduled route.	
	6.8	ensure that no passenger is left behind at the beginning or end of the route.	
	6.9	pick up and drop off only the students or persons on their authorized passenger lists and only at the designated stops.	
		report to the principal or designate regarding any personal effects left on the bus.	
		keep the bus clean and free of debris.	
		use appropriate and respectful language at all times. ensure that students are seated and remain seated during the route and while the school bus is moving.	
		ensure that all students are aware of school bus safety rules governing crossing a roadway.	
	6.15	ensure that road crossings are conducted in a safe manner, including indicating to the student when it is safe to do so and waiting to the student to finish crossing before deactivating the crossing gate and stop arm.	
	6.16	complete daily basis passenger attendance lists, odometer readings, seating plans, emergency helpers and route assessments as required by the Transportation Manager.	
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	6.18	notify parents / guardians of any route or timing changes affecting them, driver changes, bus delays or cancellations.
